

2015 SQRHA PACIFIC COAST REINING SPECTACULAR

The Pacific Coast Reining Spectacular (PCRS) attracted 440 entries to the Lockyer Indoor Equestrian Centre at Gatton, including riders from New Zealand and New South Wales. Queensland competitors came from far-flung home bases in our great state, including Roma, Calliope, Longreach, Bundaberg, Blackwater, Dalby, Gympie and Biddaddabah.

This year, SQRHA invited NRHA judges Larry W. Gleeson from Ohio USA, and Pam Spokes from Echuca VIC, to judge our prestigious show. And what a show! With over \$40,000 in cash and prizes on offer, we knew competition would be tough, but no one really expected what was to come in the days ahead. Celebrating good times and great atmosphere in a sport that makes it all happen, PCRS provided competition levels for young and old as well as for serious hobbyists and top-flight professionals. Reining has a place for everyone and PCRS was the place for reining from Wednesday 3rd June to Saturday 6th June.

Congratulations to Warren Backhouse, the winner of the Level 4 Open Derby on Lil Nu It All owned by Dennis and Erin Neylon from Neylon Performance Horses. The combined score of 153½ was one of the highest posted in Australia. When asked how he felt about his winning run, Warren said: "It is not often you come out of the pen following a run where you can say I really enjoyed that, and tonight was the second time that had happened for me."

Melanie Lindsay (Wandoan, QLD) won the Level 3 and Level 2 divisions in the Open Derby on Determinated while Jason Russell (Thangool, QLD) gathered up all three divisions of the Non Pro Derby on his horse Flirt N Hug.

What a proud moment for the owner of Pekarra Dazzling Deputy when Ben Ryan from Laceys Creek QLD won Levels 4, 3 and 2 of the Open Futurity with a score of 145. Equally gratified was David Nixon (Glen Innes, NSW) with his win in the Level 4 Non Pro Futurity on A Hollywood Jewel. Neville Connolly (Glastonbury QLD) riding Do Me A Favour won the other two divisions of the Non Pro Futurity, taking home the buckles in the Level 3 and Level 2.

Paul Sharp could not wipe the grin off his face after winning the Prime Time Non Pro on PV Treyson. This was Paul's second Pacific Coast and the first time he's broken the 69½ score barrier with a personal best, leaping over the 70 mark to get 70½. Also with a huge smile on her face after her win was Intermediate Non Pro champion Katrina Beale aboard Hustlers First Flame. Katrina and Paul are both keen members of the Calliope Sliders Reining Horse Club. Another great event was the Youth Under 13 Years where Grace Christoffel and Lethal Katie were crowned champions.

The excitement of a "run off" is always a crowd pleaser and the run off for the Rookie Professional buckle between Chris Gould on Starlights Lethal and Angie Glover on Hustlin for Chicks was no different. Both competitors rode hard and both increased their scores in the final run but the spotlight landed on Hustlin For Chicks and Angie.



2015 SQRHA PACIFIC COAST REINING SPECTACULAR

De Termination (owned, trained and ridden by Scott and Michelle Burnett from Widgee QLD) carried both his riders to winning places at PCRS. Michelle took the honours in Rookie Level 2 (71½) and followed up with a win in the Limited Non Pro (140). Stirrup lengths were adjusted, then Scott rode this amazing horse out to claim his own buckle in the Intermediate Open with a score of 73.

First time buckle winners showed us what they could do with quality rides on some quality horses. Natasha Brumby on Whizzel While U Work scored 69½ to win the Youth 14-18 Years. Brooke Sestero from Blackwater QLD on her horse Jessies Dreamchaser was over the moon when she won the Rookie Level 1 from a field of horses as strong as we have seen in the Rookie class. Brooke had been out of the saddle for a while. She began her training program early this year, often saddling up and riding well into the night after working a 12-hour shift. PCRS was her second show back after two years away.

Denise Milgate on RKN Two Eyed Kid and Greg Walker on Little Hootchy were co-champions in the Novice Horse Non Pro Level 2 with equal scores of 70. This score also won Greg the buckle in the Novice Horse Non Pro Level 1 division.

The Open divisions of the Novice Horse class saw some tough competition. The eventual Level 1 champions were Pretty Ruff and Brendan Manz with 68½. Snippin Cash and John Wicks took out the Level 2 with a score of 72.


Just two and a half weeks prior to the show, Jason and Kurt Melling flew across the Tasman Sea to land on our shores to compete at PCRS. A very supportive family kept the home fires burning back at Warkworth on New Zealand's North Island and the journey was well worth the effort. Jason and his horse Predator claimed the championship in the Non Pro with 72 then came back the next day and took out the buckle in the Limited Open with a score of 140½.

Consistent as ever, Shaun Saunders and Hasta La Vista set the pace in the Open with a score of 73. This was just too good on the day. Shaun and Hasta took home the buckle leaving the other competitors wondering what happened. Susan Camfferman and Shiney Ever After won the Freestyle with a 71.

A field of 23 riders participated in the Ladies fundraising event, Riding For A Cure. All entry monies gleaned from this class together with money raised from the Bra Bar (thanks to the Calliope Sliders for this spirited initiative) was donated to the Queensland Cancer Council for research into breast cancer. Approximately \$1,000 was raised. There were prizes galore for this heavily contested event with Helen Balu and her horse Whizkey On The Rocks posting the buckle-winning score.

Well, what a great show and what a showcase of turbo charged competition and high-level camaraderie! In many cases we saw merely a ½-point difference between Champion and Reserve Champion positions. As the year progresses, so will the capabilities of these already exceptional horses.

SQRHA sincerely appreciates the support of our major sponsors for Pacific Coast Reining Spectacular 2015: Backhouse Training Stables, LMHTV, Pigeon Waters Quarter Horse Ranch, Back On Track and Prydes EasiFeed. Friday morning was a busy day of pre-works for competitors whilst the committee were busy putting the finishing touches to the show preparations and sponsors were arriving to set themselves up in the trade area.

GVRHA BUCKLE UP & SLIDE REINING SPECTACULAR

After a day of setting up and organisation, pre-works, and a special guest appearance by a few members on WIN News Friday evening, we were almost ready for show day, but not before some last minute arena maintenance. Unfortunately, due to a prior event at the venue, the surface wasn't quite up to the usual standard. Thanks to the tireless efforts of Mick Taylor and some heavy earthmoving equipment late on Friday night, by show time Saturday morning the surface was better than ever and ready for the nearly 270 runs in store for the weekend.

Up early on Saturday morning was our first competitor, David Norbury on RKN Bobcat, warmed up and ready to open the show at 6:30 a.m. with the GVRHA Open Snaffle Bit/Hackamore 5 Years & Under class. There were 11 competitors in this early morning class with Glenn Browitt and Winskey putting in a solid performance to win on a score of 69, followed by Cameron Halliwell and Gottagetagunner coming in a close second on a 68.


Up next was Novice Horse, the biggest class of the show with a massive 40 runs! David Norbury and Greg Rau's Wimpys Whizzngem ran a 67.5 to take home the Champion buckle for the Equissage Therapy Novice Horse Open Level 1 division, with Brett Hands & Sadalbar Leeroy Brown Reserve Champions on 67. The LTD Equine Novice Horse Open Level 2 division was hotly contested with both Lana Kelderman on Josie Hale's beautiful mare Whizz Fizz and Glenn Wyse riding Julie Johnson's newly-acquired Wimpys Perfect Spin taking out the top score of 68.5, with Lana ultimately taking home the buckle!

In the Melbournes Woodheating Centre's Non Pro Level 1 division, Stephan Elenius beat 20 other riders to the buckle, scoring a 69 with his lovely gelding, Jewel Park Bewhizzed. Pam Spokes and Mustang Lil were Reserve Champions on a 67 and also Co-Champions in the Alternative Engineering Novice Horse Non Pro Level 2 alongside Janice Barr and Smart Like Scoot, with Keiran Moses and Pain In The Glass in Reserve position.

We moved straight along into another massive class – GVRHA Green Rider – with 37 entries, making it the single biggest class of the entire show. Competitors were vying not only for the places and prizes in this round, but also for their spot in the top six, to qualify for the Green Rider Shootout later in the day. With a 3-way tie between Mikayla Smith and MG My Parrs Celeste, Alex Cruse and Magnetised Gold and Hanna Hegwer and Ruf Bit Of Hickory, all scoring 64, followed by Suz Sims and Hollywoods Lil Minnie in 4th place, Kay Couch and Impressive Keeper 5th and Karen Alija and Jumped The Gun 6th, we had our top six riders for the Shootout!

Rookie L1 & L2 was to follow, another large class with a combined total of 27 entries. Following on from wins in both divisions at the recent VRHA State Show, GVRHA's very own Vice President, Terri Jones, continued her run of success with her cremello mare Pure Blonde Charlie. The combination took out the buckles for both the Ken Muston Isuzu Rookie L1 and the Redwood Print Rookie L2 on a solid 67, with Linda Chisholm and Red Hair and Freckles hot on their heels on 66.5 for Reserve Rookie L1. Khristie Martin and Tamkaura Promise of Glory also scored a 66.5 for Reserve in the Rookie L2 division.

GVRHA BUCKLE UP & SLIDE REINING SPECTACULAR

After ample time for some rest, the Top Six GVRHA Green Rider competitors were ready and raring to go again in the Green Rider Shootout. The finalists certainly had their eyes on the prize, with some fantastic runs culminating in our Champion, all the way from Tasmania, Alex Cruse aboard her beautiful palomino Magnetised Gold with a 67.5 score. Alex took home an embroidered trophy rug, beautiful garland and a fantastic Samsung Galaxy Tablet! What a great event this was and it was fantastic to see so many Green Riders supporting the event, as well as each other.

The sixth and penultimate event of the day was a concurrent run of 3 classes: the GVRHA Ladies, sponsored by Smarty Rugs & Hold Your Horses Promotional Embroidery, the Affordable Tack & Horse Wear Primetime Non Pro and the Buckaroo Trading Co Rookie Professional, RA Youth Ambassador Georgia Mundie proudly accepted the beautiful woollen embroidered trophy rug and garland for her winning 69.5 score on Termite Grounded in the Ladies class, with a three way tie for Reserve between Kim Grosso and DC Caddilac Jack, Holly Fitzsimons and Yulgilbar Valido and Susie Farguhar and CD Quixote. Susie's run also won her the Prime Time Non Pro, with Lyndon Hale & OP Whizzel Do a very close second! Katherine Kelderman and Heavens Eleven slid their way into first position in the Rookie Professional division, with Mark Jones and his horse, Hug Me and Hold Me taking Reserve for the class.

Almost at the end of a long day, the judge and scribe once again took their seats for final class of Saturday's program – the Gunnamatta Trail Rides Open and the Broker Brumbys Non Pro feature event. The Open competitors rode for added money of \$1,400 and the Non Pro riders were fighting it out for \$700 added money, plus of course buckles, rugs, garlands and prizes! It may have been late but that didn't affect the riders and horses, with some great runs in both divisions. Stephan Elenius and Jewel Park Bewhizzed continued on good form, running a 68.5 to win the Open division, with Glenn Wyse

and Julie Johnson's Wimpys Perfect Spin taking the Reserve. The Non Pro division was won by Josie Hale and the ever consistent Whiz Fizz on a fantastic 69.5 score, with Stephan's run putting him in Reserve – some great performances to conclude Saturday's events.

After a very well earned rest and a good night's sleep, everyone was keen to get the second and final day of the show started, even at 7 o'clock in the morning! The Green Riders kicked off the day with another 30 runs in the RA Green Rider Levels 1 & 2. Mikayla Smith and MG My Parrs Celeste put in a stellar performance for a score of 67.5 winning them the Level 1 division, with Tania Squire and her lovely palomino, A Little Spinalena just a whisker behind on 67, taking them to Reserve. GVRHA committee member and creator of all the beautiful garlands, Suz Sims rode into the winner's circle on her mare Hollywoods Lil Minnie in the RA Green Rider Level 2.

The second event on Sunday's program was the LTD Trailers Limited Open and the Alternative Engineering Intermediate Open, run concurrently. Mark Jones and Hug Me and Hold Me in the Limited division, scored a 67 to very happily take home the buckle, with Susie Farquhar on her gelding CD Quixote in Reserve position with a 66. In the Intermediate division, golden Wimpy ponies reigned supreme with the buckle being won by David Norbury and Greg Rau's palomino Wimpys Whizzngem with a score of 68.5 and Glenn Wyse and Julie Johnson's buckskin Wimpys Perfect Spin Reserve on 66.5.

Glenn's daughter Kasey also did the Wyse family proud in the next event, the Whitfield Garage Youth 14-18 Years, Her and her horse, Crushed Ice, scored a 66.5 putting them in a first place tie with Mikayla Smith and MG My Parrs Celeste. After an exciting run off, Kasey took home the buckle, and Mikayla earned herself an embroidered trophy rug for Reserve. □

The Youth 13 Years & Under class was taken out by Mackinley Glover riding Jessies Red Caddie with a score of 63, taking home the beautiful winner's buckle.

Continuing with the youth theme, a very special class ensued. What better way to warm up the crowd for the feature Open Futurity class than our GVRHA Fancy Dress Leadline competitors – Ellie McDonald, Cade Hands, Will and Mitchell Browne and Gizelle Sheridan – wowing the audience with their fantastic costumes and even better riding! A very special thank you to these competitors and their parents for making such a great effort!

From one highlight, leading straight into another the Open Futurity sponsored by M&S Stainless Steel, Glenn Browitt Riding Tuition & Horsemanship and Tatura Pine Shavings & Sawdust. This was the first time a Futurity has been run at GVRHA in recent years. For many of these young horses it was their first foray into the show pen-a great opportunity to get some valuable experience in advance of the Gold Buckle Futurity in September. Judges Shane Watts and Kate Elliott presided over the class of eight horses, all with the hope of winning a slice of the \$2,000 plus 80% added money! Chelsea Ragg with her horse Rubys Stylish Rose placed 8th, then Alex Cruse and Magnetised Gold, John Woods and RR Rascals Major League and David Norbury and Jodie Oakley's RKN Bobcat in a three way tie for 5th. Glenn Browitt and Winskey placed 4th, then David Norbury on Wimpys Whizzngem in 3rd place. A solid run and a score of 136 placed Cameron Halliwell and Gottagetagunner in Reserve position. Mick Taylor and My Dads A Wimp ran an impressive 139, scoring the highest individual score of the show of a 70, earning the pair the title of Buckle Up & Slide Open Futurity Champions as well as the prizes to go with it! In addition to a cut of the





The New South Wales Reining Horse Association rolled into AELEC at Tamworth to host the 2015 NSW State Championships show from the 6th to the 11th of July. More than 400 nominations were received from competitors from Victoria, Queensland and throughout NSW, all keen to take home trophy buckles and a portion of the \$25,000 prize money up for grabs.

McNevins Motel in Tamworth provided warm accommodation at the end of each long day for the judges Susan Camfferman and Shane Watts. Thanks also to Bit Judge Lynda Gray.

The show opened with 22 riders lining up to contest the Two-Handed Rookie class. It was encouraging to witness new horse-and- rider combinations as many older horses returned to the show pen to escort the Rookie riders through pattern 10. With a score of 69.5, Dee Ann Hamilton won first prize riding EP Sacromentos Playboy. The Novice Horse Open Level 1 class was tightly contested with Dualin Gal, owned and shown by Peter Gould, earning the Championship buckle with a score of 70. Ten horses contested the Novice Horse Open Level 2 division sponsored by C. A. Parnell & Associates Accountant of Goulburn in NSW. Friday evening introduced the crowd to the younger horses in the much-anticipated Futurity classes. After many hours of contemplation, planning and years of hard work these babies were now ready to begin life under the spotlight. The crowd witnessed Gottagetagunner, in fabulous form, winning the NSWRHA State Championship Open, Intermediate Open and Non Pro Futurity Buckles, scoring 142 for Cameron Halliwell. The win in an Open Futurity class highlights Cameron's considerable skills and technique.

The Reserve State Championship in the Open Futurity was awarded to Crystal Park Reys Time, ridden by John Wicks.
