#### NRHA MEMBERSHIP

Renewals for NRHA membership are now to be applied for direct to NRHA. There will be a link on the Reining Australia membership page.

Reining Australia membership will be available online as usual.

Don't forget when applying online to NRHA that you will have to fill out the appropriate paperwork as a Professional or Non Pro.

NRHA Non Pro declarations only apply to new members or those who weren't current members in 2016. All members will be emailed their RA membership card, and we encourage Affiliates to check these with their entries.

If you need any assistance with the process don't hesitate to contact the office.

#### LEASING OF HORSES

Leasing of horses became available with NRHA in 2016. All paperwork must be lodged with the NRHA before competing; lease paperwork WILL NOT be processed at shows.

Please note that leased horses are not eligible to compete in Aged classes (Futurities and Derbies).

Please note that Lessees are REQUIRED to be current members of NRHA prior to completing the lease process. Lessor MUST also have current NRHA membership.

An Associate membership is acceptable (\$25 US) in certain circumstances.

#### RANCH RIDING

We have had some enquiries from Affiliates with regards to holding Ranch Riding clinics and classes. We have contacted our insurers, Affinity, with a request to include Ranch Riding in our insurance. This is another opportunity for us to expose potential Reiners to our sport.

#### INSURANCE AND AFFILIATE MEMBERSHIP

Following discussions with Affinity we are looking at a proposal to include members on our Voluntary Workers policy. This will cover members for any accidents while riding on the grounds at all RA shows, clinic and events.

The Reining Australia Board has adopted the policy that "all members whether competing in sanctioned or non-sanctioned must belong to an Affiliate regardless of whether they are going to the Nationals, especially as the Affiliates contribute to the insurance".



#### GOLD BUCKLE PROGRAM

#### NON PRO FUTURITY GOLD BUCKLE AMNESTY

Important Rule Change for Non Pro Futurity: Commencing in 2017, all horses competing in the NON PRO Futurity must be NOMINATED into the Gold Buckle Program as a precondition of ENTRY.

An amnesty period will apply till the 31st December 2016 for all NON PRO horses to NOMINATE into the Gold Buckle Program for the 2017 Futurity and 2018 Futurity. The NOMINATION cost will remain at \$220 regardless of age (2 year-olds or 3-year-olds) till the 31st December 2016.

The amnesty is a ONE TIME OFFER and will only apply to NON PRO Futurity horses.

Should the horse also compete in the Open Division of the 2017 Futurity or 2018 Futurity, an additional \$660 NOMINATION fee will apply and 100% of the NOMINATION fee will go to the Open Divisions.

#### ENTRY FEE FOR ALL HORSES IN GOLD BUCKLE OPEN FUTURITY

The Board has made the decision to implement an entry fee on the Open Level 4 of the Gold Buckle Futurity of \$440 for all horses, payable at time of entry to the Nationals.

This is a positive decision for the future of the Gold Buckle Futurity, following on the lines of the NRHA Futurity. The change is a change to the show conditions and not a change to the program.

This entry fee will generate more prize money (minimum of \$8,000 extra) and remove the confusion that has existed over the years of the optional payment.

A full explanation will be forwarded to members.

#### TRYON (USA) TO HOST FEI WORLD EQUESTRIAN GAMES 2018

The FEI World Equestrian Games<sup>™</sup> 2018 will be held at the Tryon International Equestrian Center in North Carolina (USA) from 10 to 23 September 2018. The FEI Bureau today unanimously agreed that the Games should be awarded to Tryon, meaning that the FEI's flagship event remains in North America, following the withdrawal of Bromont (CAN) earlier this year.

The original dates for the Games (12-26 August) have been changed following two scientific studies commissioned by the FEI which stated that climatic conditions would be significantly more favourable in North Carolina during September, particularly from a horse welfare perspective. The FEI also looked at date clashes with other fixtures on the FEI Calendar to ensure the optimum timeslot for the 2018 Games.

"We are very pleased to announce Tryon as the host of the FEI World Equestrian Games 2018", FEI President Ingmar de Vos said. "The Tryon team submitted a really impressive bid and we have every confidence in the organising committee. It's a truly spectacular venue and almost all the necessary infrastructure for our eight disciplines is already in place. We are looking forward to a fantastic celebration of top level sport as all the disciplines come together to crown their world champions at the Games in two years' time."

The Tryon International Equestrian Center, created by Mark Bellissimo in Mill Spring, North Carolina, is situated on a 1,600 acre site at the foothills of the Blue Mountains. The venue has 1,200 permanent stables, 12 arenas including a floodlit international arena with a potential spectator seating capacity of up to 12,000 and VIP seating for up to 1,500, a covered arena with 5,000 seats, and has a worldclass cross country course that will be used for both Eventing and Driving. The venue is surrounded by hundreds of miles of equestrian trails for Endurance. The venue contains excellent facilities for athletes and spectators including restaurants, hospitality, accommodation, retail and resort amenities. An onsite state-of-the-art veterinary facility is currently under construction.

"We are thrilled with this news and thank the FEI Bureau for having faith in us and entrusting us with the honour of hosting this prestigious event", Mark Bellissimo said. "It's a really great fit for North Carolina's equestrian heritage and we look forward to working closely with the FEI and with the USEF to produce fabulous FEI World Equestrian Games in 2018."

The FEI World Equestrian Games 2018 were previously awarded to Bromont (CAN), but a lack of secure funding led to mutual agreement between the FEI and the Canadian Comité organisateur des Jeux Équestres Mondiaux 2018 (COJEM) to terminate the host contract in July of this year.

Following the withdrawal of Bromont, the FEI Bureau mandated the President to find a solution and, after a thorough assessment of a number of options, the President proposed that the Bureau allocate the Games to Tryon. In light of the timeframe, with the Games in less than two years, existing infrastructure was a crucial factor in the evaluation process.

The Bureau met by teleconference on 3 November to agree to the allocation and were unanimous in their support of the Tryon bid.

"The FEI is 100% committed to the FEI World Equestrian Games concept and we are extremely grateful to all those that showed interest in hosting the 2018 Games", Ingmar de Vos said. "Their enthusiasm demonstrates the importance of the event across the equestrian community."

The FEI World Equestrian Games, held every four years in the middle of the Olympic cycle, is one of the biggest events on the global sporting calendar, combining eight World Championships at one event. The FEI disciplines - Jumping, Dressage and Para-Equestrian Dressage, Eventing, Driving, Endurance, Vaulting and Reining - are all included on the competition schedule.

The inaugural FEI World Equestrian Games were hosted in Stockholm (SWE) in 1990. Since then the Games have been staged in The Hague (NED) in 1994, Rome (ITA) in 1998, Jerez (ESP) in 2002, and Aachen (GER) in 2006. The first Games to be organised outside Europe were the Alltech FEI World Equestrian Games<sup>™</sup> in Kentucky (USA) 2010. The Games came back to Europe for the 2014 edition, the Alltech FEI World Equestrian Games in Normandy (FRA).
